A Voice We All Recognised

Our August meeting welcomed Moth Mark Williams of Eden Radio, who was invited to give members a taste of his broadcasting career — and what a career it turned out to be.

Moth Mark kicked things off in the Defence Force, serving with the Signals Corps and the Imperial Light Horse, proving that even in his younger days he had a knack for making sure messages got through loud and clear.

From there, it was a short leap from military signals to broadcast signals, and Moth Mark found himself at SABC Television before becoming a founding member of M-Net — back when it was still something of a novelty rather than just another channel to scroll past.

His CV then reads like a who's who of South African broadcasting: stints with Fox TV, TV Africa, and finally LM Radio, a name that visibly lit up a fair few faces in the room. Judging by the nostalgic murmurs, LM Radio clearly left its mark on more than one Moth's misspent youth.



These days, Moth Mark has turned his considerable experience toward getting Eden Radio off the ground, and by all accounts, it's now broadcasting loud and proud. He gave members an entertaining run-down of how the station came to be and where it's headed — proof that after a lifetime behind the microphone, some Moths simply can't stop talking (and thankfully, we wouldn't want him to).

Don't Let the Lights Go Out: A Frank word to Every Member Who Wears The Moth Badge

A Shellhole does not die from a single blow. It does not collapse under the weight of one difficult year, one poorly attended parade, or one fractious meeting. It dies slowly, and almost invisibly from accumulated neglect, repeated small failures, and the quiet withdrawal of men who once cared enough to join but no longer care enough to stay engaged.

It dies one absent member at a time. One silent meeting at a time. One snide remark, one unanswered call for volunteers, one resignation encouraged over a beer rather than discouraged with a conversation. We are heirs to something worth preserving. The Shellhole is not a social convenience or a drinking club that happens to wear a badge. It is a living memorial to those who served, to those who did not come home, and to the bonds forged under conditions most people will never experience. Every Shellhole that closes its doors quietly extinguishes that flame in its community. There is no replacement waiting in the wings.



The twenty behaviours listed below are not the failings of an imaginary thought. They are the ordinary habits of disengaged men, habits that feel harmless in isolation but are lethal in combination. A member who arrives late causes no great damage on his own. But a Shellhole full of members who arrive late, leave early, say nothing, do nothing, and recruit nobody is a Shellhole measuring its own obituary. Every one of those behaviours is a choice. Made consciously or by default, it is still a choice and it has consequences that extend well beyond the individual who makes it.

20 Ways to March Your Shellhole Into the Ground

1. Miss Meetings and Parades

Stay away from official functions. When you do appear, arrive late — and let others carry the chairs.

2. Disappear Before Last Post

Leave before the function closes. Never stay to clean up or pack away. That is someone else's problem.

3. Hold Your Tongue, Then Open It

Sit silent during the meeting. Wait until it is over, then air every grievance you refused to raise on the floor

4. Turn Up Only for the Good Times

Do nothing to build the Shellhole. Contribute no labour, no time, no ideas, but make certain you are first in line when things are enjoyable.

5. Snipe at Your Executives

Criticise leadership freely, but offer no solutions and accept no responsibility yourself.

6. Treat Membership as Spectator Sport

Take no part in organisational affairs or work parties. Watch others build the club and regard your own absence as harmless.

8. Draw and Never Deposit

Collect every benefit the Shellhole offers. Return nothing no effort, no service, no contribution of any kind.

9. Keep the Shellhole to Yourself

Never introduce a prospective member. Let the rolls thin out in silence.

10. Preach Teamwork, Practise None

Speak warmly of comradeship and cooperation. When work is required, be unavailable.



11. Threaten Resignation

Announce at intervals that you are leaving. Encourage like-minded members to follow. Do this instead of fixing what troubles you.

12. Claim Perpetual Busyness

When called upon to assist, plead commitments. Deploy this excuse without limit and without guilt.

13. Remain Deliberately Uninformed

Never read the minutes or keep abreast of Shellhole affairs. Ignorance provides useful cover for inaction.

14. Criticise Instead of Contributing

Finding fault requires far less effort than taking responsibility. Settle comfortably into that habit.

15. Do the Bare Minimum When You Cannot Avoid a Task

If a duty is assigned to you, perform as little as possible or simply vanish until it is forgotten.

16. Resent Those Who Step Forward

When a fellow member puts in the hard work, call it pointless. Rally the idlers and validate their inertia.

17. Choose Your Side by its Negativity

Back whoever is most critical of the Shellhole. Make no effort to understand or resolve the issue, simply align yourself with the dissatisfied.

18. Use the Shellhole for Personal Gain

Treat the organisation as a vehicle for your own interests. Place self-advancement above the welfare of the membership.

19. Spread Despondency

Circulate bad news freely. Suppress good news or deny it. A demoralised Shellhole suits you better than a thriving one.

20. Undermine Leaders at Every Turn

Take every opportunity to erode confidence in elected officers, but decline to stand for office yourself when the nomination book is open.

Your Shellhole is asking nothing more of you now than you once gave without question—Choose accordingly.

Getting to Know Eden Radio

For those who enjoyed Moth Mark Williams' address in August, here's a bit more background on the station now broadcasting proudly from our own backyard, the Edenvale Bowling Club.

History

Eden Radio began life in 2014 as an online-only station under the name Edenvale Radio, and by mid-2015 had built a streaming audience of over 8,000 listeners both locally and internationally. Momentum kept building, and in October 2015 the station secured its official AM broadcast frequency licence from ICASA. Since then, the station has continued to grow, re-branding and relaunching along the way, and now broadcasts as Eden Radio 104.8 FM — proof that patience, persistence, and a good playlist eventually pay off.



Aims and Goals



Eden Radio operates as a registered non-profit community radio station, with a clear focus on serving Edenvale and the surrounding suburbs. Community safety is a particular priority — the station maintains direct contact with the CPF, SAPS, EMPD, and private security companies, allowing serious incidents to be announced without delay. Beyond safety, the station aims to include everyone in the community, with demographics and language treated as important considerations — in other words, whether you're a die-hard Elvis fan or partial to something a little more current, there's a place for you on the dial.

Station Overview

Billing itself as "The Voice from the Vale," Eden Radio is a nostalgia-driven community station offering a mix of chart hits from the 60s through to the 90s, blended with a touch of today's best music. The station describes itself as community-first, aiming to bring the Vale together through good conversation and the music listeners love — think fewer awkward silences than your average family braai, and considerably better tunes.
